COFFEE NOTES ADVERT FOR MARCH

STINSFORD PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Notice boards:

Parishioners may be aware of the strange case of the disappearing notice boards. We have four notice boards in Stinsford Parish. They have a wooden frame with a plywood backing and have all suffered severely in the relentless wet weather of Autumn. Water has entered the enclosures and damaged backing boards and cork boards. One board has also been vandalised and this has led to further weather damage. Two boards (Higher and Lower Bockhampton) have been taken down and given a month to dry out. They are in the process of being rebuilt and receiving multiple coats of varnish and will be back up by the end of January. The vandalised board will be assessed to see if it is recoverable. All this work is being done by volunteers and the PC will only pay for materials.

Lower Bockhampton Playground:

Given the very dispersed nature of the parish, you may not have noticed the work undertaken

in the last six months. The playground is partially surrounded by a very attractive stone wall. The wall has been severely weakened by water penetration over a number of years and by some ad hoc repairs with cement mortar.

The PC was able to engage an enthusiastic lime-work specialist who has thoroughly overhauled the wall, rebuilding in places, fully recapping, and completely repointing. It is now a considerable improvement to the Conservation Area and is much stronger and safer.

Kingston Maurward students and staff helped this project by strimming and mowing the grass before and after the work. In return, our lime specialist gave a workshop to Construction students on the special qualities of lime work. Kingston Maurward has provided long-term help in maintaining the playground and the PC thanks them for it. We are currently finishing a winter repair programme and the playground will be fully open in the early Spring.





Elections 2024

Charminster Parish Council consists of 2 wards North and South. As from May 2024 and the recent Community Governance review there will be: North ward is made up of 5 Councillors and covers Charlton Down and Forston.

South ward is made up of 7 Councillors and covers Charminster.

Parish Council elections are to be held on 2nd May 2024.

Nominations open Mid-February, forms can be submitted from 12th March by hand to Dorset Council but need to be submitted by 4th April. Forms can be obtained from the Parish Clerk, or from the Dorset Council website.

Eligibility to become a Councillor:

You are over 18 or over on the day you submit your nomination paper and are a British, Commonwealth or European Union Citizen and at least one of the following:

- a registered local government elector in the parish area in which you wish to stand as a candidate.
- Occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.
- Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish area.
- You have lived in the parish area or within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the
 day of election.

After the elections all Councillors will need to sign an acceptance of office and submit a register of interests.

CHARLTON DOWN CRICKET CLUB

Happy New Year from Charlton Down CC. It's a quiet time cricket-wise in Jan and Feb, so I thought it would be an opportunity to write about something completely different.

As well as maintaining the playing area, for the last few years the club (and groundsman John Pallister in particular) have been actively managing the surrounding areas to benefit our local wildlife. In part, this started as a happy accident when our strimmer broke down, and in part it has been a planned project supported by Redwood House to create a wild flower garden in a neglected area that had become a bit of a dumping ground. This all started in Spring 2020 at the time of the first Covid lockdown and, by complete chance, a local resident was taking notice of the changes during the short walks that were permitted at the time. Jessica Winder is a keen naturalist and photographer and has been writing a blog about the wild flower project since it started. So far, the species list stands at 70, mostly native wild flowers and a few garden escapees. Many of the plants have been beautifully photographed and posted on her blog, which is available for anyone to see. As hyperlinks don't really work on the printed page, the best way to find her blog is to search for 'Jessica Winder waste ground to wild garden'. We're lucky to have Jessica documenting the project as it is something we would never have thought to do ourselves. It is also rewarding to see that we are enhancing our local flora and in turn supporting a diverse assemblage of insects and other wildlife. I would say that it is very simple to create a wild flower area of your own, but I suspect that Pally (who has done battle with a very persistent thicket of stinging nettles for the last 3 years) would disagree!

With cricket still a speck on the horizon, the focus is very much on our social calendar. Coffee mornings continue every Thursday from 10am to 12.30ish. Don't be shy in coming down if you've not been before - Joan and Pally will take good care of you. Every Friday evening the bar is open from around 7pm. Quiz night and the monthly draw will be on 23rd Feb, while on 16th Feb we'll be turning up the heat for the club's first ever Tropical Beach Night. To be honest, at the time of writing, I'm not sure what this will involve, but I imagine some cocktails and Hawaiian shirts may be in the mix. More detail to come on our Facebook page and notice boards. Social membership for 2024 is now due - just £5 for the year.

Well here we are into 2024, and already February being the first Pilot edition in the new year. It was a learning curve and enjoyed by all. We managed to have the tree in place for the event.

The week after the church was fully decorated for the festivities. The Rangers at Thorncombe provided the holly and ivy and greenery came from the church walls and grounds. The KMC Floristry Department assisted by decorating the west door and the pillars inside the church. Our sincere thanks to all our flower arrangers who willingly take part to provide such an excellent show. St Michael will make a donation to the Puddletown Middle School Benevolent Fund.

This year then saw the biennial event "Going the Rounds" held on the Saturday evening with some excellent musicians, singers and readers plus a further band of folk, making up a party of around a hundred. Meeting at the Visitor Centre, Thorncombe Woods and proceeded to the cottage where the first Christmas carols and readings took place, all as per "Under the Greenwood Tree", then to the Kingston Maurward

DORSET APPLE CAKE

Making a Dorset apple cake is one of the most satisfying. productive and therapeutic things any Dorset man can do. It combines order, method and muckiness in perfect proportions.

There are as many recipes as people in the county – mine is a blend of several and the result of experimentation and trial and error - especially error.

This is going to get sticky and sloppy! Prepare all the ingredients before you stick your hands in the (big!) mixing bowl and grease the cake tin with margarine in advance.

INGREDIENTS

Three large cooking apples, peeled, cored and diced An orange and a lemon chopped fine – not peeled! 175g margarine

125q light brown sugar

50g dark brown sugar

3 eggs

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 170C Roll your sleeves up Combine the margarine and sugar in a large mixing bowl Add the eggs, then the flour Then add the apple, orange, lemon and dried fruit Mix well (enjoy!)

Put into a 20cm cake tin resting on an oven tray.


Top with a sprinkling of demerara sugar

Cook in the oven at 170C until risen and golden brown and so it doesn't cling to a knife when you stick one in

Remove from the oven and allow to cool before removing from the cake tin

Don't wash the mixing bowl until children and grandchildren (and the wife) have licked it clean. They will remember this... Eat with lots of cream, a local cider and good company.

IX ANSWERS

- It's believed the name comes from the Celtic word meaning heap of stones and probably refers to a rocky or stony stream

- She confessed to the "wicked and detestable offence of fornication with Christopher Harbyn." There is no record of Mr Harbyn having to pay similar penance.

- 6. It was built in the early 1700s as an alehouse called The Royal Oak. In its stables were spare horses to help teams climb the steep hill.
- Charminster School. The book says the vicar was automatically chairman of governors. "This was not without problems, as the vicar at that time was in gaol for embezzlement..."

- 10. What was then called the Dorset County Lunatic Asylum. The psychiatric hospital closed in 1992. The book says it was a source of pride that the people of Charminster played a "valuable part in the long struggle to ease the lives of mentally troubled people."

SSEN is working in and around Charminster to deliver a cable replacement scheme that will provide a modern and more resilient electricity network in the area.

The scheme will replace 3.4km of existing fluid-filled cables between the Charminster Primary 33/11kV substation on Wanchard Lane and an existing 33kV pole to the east of Charminster; from where the circuit continues as overhead line back towards Puddletown 33/11kV substation. There will be no interruption to your electricity supply as a result of these works

Why are we doing this work?

The 33kV oil-filled circuit running between Charminster and Puddletown has developed a serious leak along a railway line on Network Rail property. It is deemed unviable and unsafe to repair and reenergise this section of cable and the leaking section has already been cut, drained and capped.

The replacement 4.6km of underground XLPE cable is not oil-filled, and our installation route will remove the need to access some assets on Network Rail land, where gaining access for repairs and maintenance can cause delays for safety reasons.

Our project will futureproof and strengthen your area's power supply to cope with severe weather events as we will be improving circuit operability, enabling us to switch to alternative operating assets in the event of a fault or for planned maintenance





Minimising traffic disruption and noise

We understand that these works may cause some access disruption and noise however, using industry best practice, our contractors will do everything to minimise any inconvenience. Lool out for our maintenance signs on the road network for further information and diversions.

The nature of these works will mean that, for some phases of the project delivery, we will be closing the roads for our works to take place supported by a temporary traffic management system to be put in place. These measures will be planned by us in association with Highways England and local authorities

The key roads impacted are shown on the map below. Each coloured phase will itself be delivered in stages. This means that, while the road will be closed where we are working (except for Old Sherborne Road and North Street which will be managed under 3-way traffic light control), vehicular access to properties will be maintained as far as practicable, even it direction of access may change.

Vehicular diversion signage will be in place for each phase, but it is intended that pedestrian access will be maintained at all times unless a brief temporary closure is required to keep pedestrians and the site team safe; the site team will advise you if this is the case.
