Women and families talk of their shock, the devastating side effects that can occur – hair loss, weight gain, low level infections. 

STINSFORD NEWS

As I write we have just passed the 1st of September which is considered the first day of Autumn by the meteorological profession. On 30th August a magnificent Blue Super Moon preceded, the Autumn Equinox on 23rd. September will follow so Harvest Festival will be this weekend when the church will be decorated and our Sunday service held on the 24th at 11.00am.

The Dorset County Show was a great success this year with two of the best consecutive days weatherwise for quite some time. As can be seen by the attached photograph Michael Legg was amongst the "first prize" winners. The photo shows two ewe lambs, home grown and born this year in March. They were shown by George and Phoebe, Mick's twin grandchildren . Picking a pair from a limited number does not come easy but as they say, "Old skill's never fail" and Mick has been raising and showing sheep for some decades.

In the Dorchester & Weymouth Beekeepers new apiary in the Hanbury extension, under the supervision of their experienced members including Richard Norman and Sally Leslie, work has seen the results of those participating in this year's beginners course. The team has been regularly visiting the site on Saturdays, to set up the hives, introduce the colonies, check for good health and that they are queen right i.e. she is present and laying, through to taking off this year's honey crop. The seasonal Bee Inspector, Kevin Pope, visited to ensure they were aware of what good health looked like and a tick in the box was attained for their efforts. Three labelled jars of honey were entered in the Dorset Show, under the novice class named 'Mellstock Church Honey', plus an observation hive. The latter allows the general public to safely see, without the necessity for protective clothing, the Queen, Drones and Workers go about their daily routines. With some 40 classes and 30 plus members entering both the open and closed classes as well as the novices, it all made for a good display in the marguee. Should any person be thinking of taking up the hobby do not hesitate to contact me and I will put you in touch with the appropriate person. The course allows practical management of bees plus some tutorial so that there is an understanding of the life cycle of all three categories of bee plus insights into disease that can affect your bees as well as the many other pollinators.

Another skill which we have along Church Lane, and noticeably present at the Show is that of the Blacksmith. Simon Grant-Jones, besides now being a member of the illustrious Company of Blacksmiths as well as a past Chair of the Guild of Blacksmiths, has now passed the baton to Kevin (Fabrication) and Robert (Blacksmithing) and they continue to bring forward young skilled people both men and women at the Blacksmith and Welding Department of Kingston Maurward College. These were the group who helped us to replace the Bockhampton Cross. In addition the Guild has regular weekend meetings either at KMC or Lineham for beginners, up to the very experienced wanting to extend their expertise. The Blacksmith Guild is to work more closely with the British Farriers and Blacksmiths Association who have a permanent office at Stoneleigh Park.

30th September will see the Parish Michaelmas Fayre from 11am:

There will be refreshments served from the courtyard of the old Rectory and stalls of varying kinds in and around the church. Please come along and enjoy, and take the chance to catch up with all the developments and activities of the year, we would love to see you and there and there will be a little Mellstock Church honey for sale. The Purbeck Choir will be appearing as part of a round robin tour they are making. I must admit I look forward to their musical compositions.

October 30th at 2.00 a.m. brings the annual seasonal change in the time with one hour taken away and a return to Greenwich Mean Time thus we revisit the time change of our Evensongs for the Winter, moving earlier to 4.00 pm. in the afternoon.

SEEKING VOLUNTEERS FOR NEW ELISABETH FRINK EXHIBITION

Dorset Museum is currently seeking enthusiastic volunteers to support the stewarding of a major new exhibition opening on 2 December 2023.

Elisabeth Frink: A View from Within will run until 21 April 2024 in the Museum's Special Exhibition Gallery. It will explore Frink's artistic process, personal life, and the influences that shaped her work.

The exhibition highlights artworks created at her Woolland studio including sculptures, prints, drawings, and personal possessions from the Elisabeth Frink Estate's collection, acquired by Dorset Museum in 2020. Some of these objects have never been on public display, such as working plasters that provided the basis for Frink's bronze sculptures, and tools used in the Woolland studio.

The exhibition is arranged through eight themed sections, where visitors will be able to gain unique perspectives on Frink's life and art. From her family and social life in Woolland to her studio and work processes, each section offers captivating insights into this fascinating artist. Visitors will be able to discover Frink's work processes, experimentation with techniques, her interest in the relationship between humans and animals as well as her spiritual beliefs.

To ensure visitors enjoy an exceptional experience, the Museum is actively seeking volunteers to serve as Gallery stewards. These volunteers will play a pivotal role in engaging with visitors, offering information about the exhibition, and performing a key role in ensuring that objects on display are supervised at all times.

No prior background in art or knowledge about Elisabeth Frink's work is necessary for potential volunteers, as we encourage everyone to explore and learn about the artist and her connection to Dorset during the exhibition.

He gave a very interesting talk on Annie Keats, a local girl, who was a nurse in Dorchester during WW1. There were several Voluntary Aid Detachment (VAD) hospitals in Dorchester, one of which was Colliton House, and this is where Annie worked during the whole of WW1. The hospital building, and additional marquees in the grounds, was able to house 100 patients at any one time. Annie was paid an annual salary of £18 per year when she first started, but this had risen to £22 by the time war was over. Brian showed us slides of old photos of the hospital, its staff and patients, and also excerpts of Annie's autograph book which included poems, cartoons and little paintings.

We now look forward to our next meeting in October which will be our Harvest Supper. Hopefully

everyone will bring a plate of food to share, and any excess produce from the garden, jams/chutneys, etc, to sell. We will have an Autumn display with members bringing along anything related to the season.

At the end of the meeting we said goodbye to Jo Humphreys, who is moving out of the area. She has been a member of Charminster WI for 22 years and has been an active member of our Committee. Wishing her well for the future, she was presented with a gift as a thank you from us all.

Dear Readers

As your local PCSO I am still patrolling although you may not of seen me as regularly as you would like. This is due to a number of factors but I am always contactable as are other members of the Neighbourhood policing team via - DORCHESTER NPT LINK: Dorchester | Your area | Dorset Police | Dorset Police or via CONTACT US LINK: Contact us | Dorset Police

- PLEASE NOTE - Silent 999 calls have increased and the large majority of these are "pocket dials". If taking your phone out with you, please ensure that the screen/keypad is locked, to avoid any unnecessary calls. If you accidentally dial 999, please do not hang up. If possible, please stay on the line and let the operator know it was an accident and that you do not need any assistance. Silent calls to 999 are never just ignored. Nationally, all emergency services are experiencing record high 999 call volumes, which is believed has been impacted because of an update to Android smartphones. The update, issued between October 2022 and February 2023, added a new SOS



emergency function for devices to call 999 through the power button being pressed five times or more on devices.

If you have an Android phone, you can check your emergency settings to turn off the functionality added in the latest update, if you wish to.

Go to 'settings' then 'safety and emergency' and slide the button which says 'emergency SOS' to switch the functionality off.

- Withdrawal of 101 email address: Improving the way, you contact us

We receive thousands of digital contacts from residents and visitors every month and contact overall to Dorset Police has recently been reaching record levels. It is important for us to use the best systems and processes to ensure emergency lines are kept open and non-emergency calls can be answered from those who are unable to contact us online. We have been looking at ways to ensure we can meet the needs of our communities as quickly as possible as well as ensuring that members of the public are directed to the correct agency, such as the local authority, who may be best placed to deal with their request for service. Following the launch of our new website in March, we have seen a huge increase in the quality of information captured on digital reports completed via our website, ensuring we are able to record crimes effectively and task officers and staff appropriately

- Why are we making these changes?

We are asking members of the public to use these web forms when contacting us digitally instead of sending an email to ensure we have all the relevant information we need and can respond as efficiently as possible – meaning we get you the advice, information and help you need as soon as possible.

Our non-emergency email was withdrawn from 5 June 2023 and digital contact should be made via our website - CONTACT US LINK: Contact us | Dorset Police. Alternatively, you can still contact us for non-emergency enquiries by calling 101.







DATE: 25 August 2023 News from Central Dorset Citizens Advice

After a somewhat mixed 'summer' we are now heading towards winter and this means higher heating costs. There will be an announcement about the Energy Cap at some point, but heating costs will still put a strain on many people's budgets. So to help you out, here are a few things to check:

- Are you getting all the welfare benefits you are entitled to? There's a good overview, and links to 'benefit calculators', on Citizens Advice:
 https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/benefits/benefits-introduction/what-benefits-can-i-get/
- Are you due any of the Government's Cost of Living payments? For example, if you are on certain means-tested benefits you will get £300 in the Autumn, and for pensioners, if you're entitled to a Winter Fuel Payment for winter 2023 to 2024, you will get an extra £150 or £300 paid with your normal payment from November 2023. https://www.gov.uk/guidance/cost-of-living-payment#low-income-benefits-and-tax-credits-cost-of-living-payment
- Have you got additional costs now the new school year has started? Help is available, for example, children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 automatically get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support. Also, if you're on a low income, your Local Education Authority may also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs.

- Can you save money on other bills? There are some 'social tariffs' for people on low incomes, for example broadband and phone packages. More information on Ofcom: https://www.ofcom.org.uk/phones-telecoms-and-internet/advice-for-consumers/costs-and-billing/social-tariffs
- And finally, be aware that Dorset is now on the list for 'managed migration', which
 means some people on the older benefit systems, like tax credits, will be getting a



THE PILOT CONTACTS

PRINCES PLOT NATURE RESERVE

This parish-owned nature reserve is open to everyone. It lies to the east of Mill Lane by the sluice and was given to the parish many years ago. It is named after the horse that grazed there! The field is part of the ancient field system of the parish. No good as arable land, it had been used for grazing and as a coppice. It must at one time been full of plants and insects typical of Dorset's steep chalk downs but today is virtually a desert as far as biodiversity is concerned. The parish council is determined to improve that.

Left to its own without horses or sheep to graze, it has been reverting to scrub and dense woodland. A contractor has been engaged to create a number of different habitats and control the blackthorn through the use of different mowing regimes, and to regenerate the coppicing. We want to re-create the conditions where native chalkland plants, insects, birds and small mammals can thrive. Maybe, one day, even orchids will appear.

All the grass areas will be cut very short every winter to reduce the vigour of scrubby plants like blackthorn. We will also spread the seed of yellow rattle, an annual plant that reduces the vigour of grasses and has been used successfully in the Churchyard, , leaving space for wild flowers.

There will be different mowing frequencies in different areas. Some will be kept fairly short in summer so plants that like short grass can thrive: clovers, daisies, buttercups and plantains. Other areas will be cut less frequently to encourage plants that flower in early summer (like pasque flower, horseshoe vetch, sainfoin, round-headed rampion, vipers bugloss, gromwell, wild candytuft, chalk milkwort, field mouse ear, kidney, vetch, hounds

tongue, cutleaved selfheal, hoary plantain, salad burnet, common rockrose and large wild thyme). Cutting in May and then in autumn will encourage late flowering plants (like birdsfoot trefoil, lady's bedstraw, field scabious, harebell, small scabious, wild mignonette, marjoram, rest harrow, long-stalked cranesbill and vervain).

When you see someone mowing during the spring and summer, remember that we are not killing wild flowers but encouraging different wild flowers, and the creatures that depend on them.

What you will particularly notice is the coppicing: it will look alarming, but it is a good cause. It will be spread out over several years so the plants will be at different stages. Coppicing, mostly of hazels, has been traditional in Charminster for centuries. It involves cutting everything off at ground level so the plant can regenerate. The wood would have been used for fuel, furniture or hurdles. The ground will be opened to the light so that plants that like dappled shade will do well, unlike in the almost plant-free dark shade that exists today.

The cut grass, after drying to allow seeds to fall to the ground is to be raked to the bottom of the site. This reduces the nutrient level of the meadows as this encourages diversity. The heaps of dry grass will join the cut timber to provide an ideal place for lots of creepy-crawlies and the things that eat them, as well as safe nesting sites.

A botanical survey carried out last year was very disappointing. Another study in 5 years' time will tell us if we have been successful.

We hope you will enjoy watching the positive changes to this valuable community asset.
