It was obvious that the magazine wouldn't survive if we had to increase advertising rates by the same amount, so we set about looking for alternative solutions.

Our search led us to Epic Creative Print of Dorchester, who came up with an innovative arrangement, which we have adopted. The first change as you can see is the increase in the size of the magazine. This is easier to produce and offers us more space. The second change that you will notice is that Epic have taken on the job of composing the magazine, giving us a smarter more readable publication. This means that our brilliant editorial duo, Mel and Claire now just have to send the content to Epic who then put the magazine together taking a big load off their shoulders.

Another change that you will probably **not** notice is that Epic are carbon offsetting the raw material used, and this allows us to have a certificate from the World Land Trust. In these times we are all keen to be more sustainable and aware of our impact on the environment.

We have had to reduce the number of issues a year to ten to stay within budget, so there will not be a January, or August Pilot, but times of church services for these months will appear in the preceding edition.

The Pilot Team hope that you enjoy the new look and keep supporting our community magazine.



We hope to have a little Mellstock honey for sale on the day, it being produced by the Dorchester and Weymouth Beekeepers Association's Apiary, located in the Hanbury, where they school the beginners.

Please see the posters or comment on the radio and come along, relax and enjoy.

Hope you have all seen the series of programmes on Channel 5 narrated by Alan Titchmarsh on the county of Dorset. So far it has seemed to receive mixed reviews some thinking it covered too much and tended to jump about but it was good to see the county get some excellent television coverage around the amazing amount of interest we have, in fact I think it could have easily been a series of twelve programmes instead of six. Bearing in mind they were quick to get the series on the television when filming at St Michael's in early June we have to give them full marks however bringing it out just in time for the holiday season.

We now look forward to the ITV series in September, we understand to include Martin Clunes.

The first year of the revised service times has been completed with morning services at 11 a.m. and the last service in the month being a 6.00 p.m. Evensong in summer and 4pm in winter. Should we have a fifth Sunday in the month we repeat the Evensong but this as an agreed ongoing Joint Benefice event at Stinsford followed by a drink and eats. July had a fifth Sunday and we had the opportunity to wish Malcolm Davis a Happy 81st Birthday with the organ being played on this occasion by Charminster's organist Neil Cuthill. With a good congregation made up of our normal congregation and others from around the benefice, and holidaying visitors it was a joyful event, Malcolm managed to avoid the chocolate cake.

September 9th brings the annual Ride and Stride event and we hope to have entries taking part this year so should others like to join in please do so. We have the journey route made by participators on the last occasion so should anybody wish to have a copy do let me know. So whether you be a Walker, Cyclist or Horse Rider here is an opportunity for a little or lot of exercise and to enjoy a thoroughly good day. Notices are up on the church and PCC boards and further information found at Dorset Historic Churches Trust www.dhct.org.uk Ride and Stride where you can also download a sponsorship form. I think the record is still held by Alan Neades of Piddlehinton who once visited over 30 churches/chapels on the day and I am sure he will be participating again this year.

The PCC met in July, a number of issues were discussed, notably Christmas Services, repairs to the Alarm System, the Fete and Festival plus the introduction of a card reader as an alternative to cash. The PCC viewed the latest version of our film we made to show the Diocesan Advisory Committee the intended whereabouts of the refectory/toilet and the reasons for the need. This was approved and would be forwarded by Leila to the appropriate department in Salisbury.

Even as a child, he had realised he wanted to be a journalist, and, at 18 years old, he was lucky to be offered an apprenticeship in the local newspaper in his home town of Leicester. Over the years he progressed, working in broadcasting, especially BBC local radio, in different areas of the country. During his career he interviewed numerous wellknown figures including Margaret Thatcher, Brian Clough, and Eric Morecambe. He was involved in reporting major events such as the death of Diana, Princess of Wales, the Brighton hotel bombing, the Hillsborough disaster, and the Manchester Arena bombing. In more recent years he has travelled to many parts of the world advising governments on how to handle public information and the media during a crisis. Nigel has agreed to join us again next year to tell us more about his fascinating career.

Keeping to the theme of journalism, our members' competition was to find a humorous article from a newspaper or magazine. Nigel judged the entries and the winner was Pat Tinker who brought along this quote from a church magazine – "The preachers for the next six weeks can be found nailed up in the church porch".






