STINSFORD PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At a special meeting of Stinsford Parish Council, called to understand the impact of the North of Dorchester development on downstream water supply, Hydrogeologist Paul Stanfield from Wessex Water gave a presentation on the potential implications of the possible building of up to 4,0000 houses plus industrial sites.

While he said he was confident that there would be an adequate supply of water to meet demand, the company was less reassuring about the implications of any development on water quality.

Most of you will know that we rely on groundwater for all our water in this area and the development would turn the catchment from rural to urban, with multiple associated pollution risks. Paul was particularly concerned about the unknowns – e.g. the nature of the proposed business units.

The development would actually sit in the inner source protection zone where there is the greatest threat to drinking water.

Paul said that while the risks could be managed with proper planning, he admitted that serious contamination of the groundwater in that area could be 'disastrous."

He explained that the company's biggest concern was the long-term cumulative impacts

of contamination on the groundwater and that, in time, this could result in serious deterioration such that Wessex Water may have to install a water treatment works – at present the quality of our water is so good that this isn't required. He was not able to give an answer to the question about what it would mean for the many private water supplies in the parish.

While Wessex Water are legally obliged to support any development, Paul said that they can raise concerns with the developer and councils. They are monitoring the situation closely.

Stinsford Parish Council will be holding another public meeting on this topic with a speaker from the Environment Agency. Watch this space for details when confirmed

Or join the new "Stinsford Parish and Community" Facebook site (case sensitive). This is a group open to all who live and work in the Parish of Stinsford. We have made it a 'private group' to try to reduce misuse by trolls and commercial enterprises. When you visit the site, you will need to apply to join: we will try to turn round your membership as quickly as possible. The more people join the group, the more it will reflect the nature of Stinsford and the better it will be for communicating all Stinsford events.

A RIVER RUNS THROUGH IT

The Bridleway between Lower Bockhampton and Stinsford should be a gem in the literary and landscape heritage of Dorset. It is Hardy's 'embowered path'. It is also the main walking, cycling and horse-riding route for local residents to Dorchester and Stinsford Church. It is a delightful route...or should be!

The path is falling into a state of disrepair: the riverbank is repeatedly eroded, the path surface has been repeatedly washed away in numerous winter floods, the bridge at Stinsford now has its approach

completely eroded and dumped into the river, further distorting the complex drainage in the area. Only attempt this walk with high wellies, waders, and a degree of personal agility.

Stinsford Parish Council has repeatedly demanded that this lovely part of Dorset, central to the Hardy Heritage, be urgently restored to its former state. Dorset Council has postponed vital works for a number of years. Each year that passes means greater erosion and damage and thus greater repair costs.

Join with us in demanding that Dorset Council acts to preserve this vital part of Dorset's past and present (SPC would like to acknowledge the help given by Cllr David Tayor on this issue)


Most Successful Charity Quiz yet! Organiser & Quizmaster - Richard Wareham is

HEALTH AND FITNESS - MARCH - 2024

What do you spend 11 minutes doing? That fiendish quick crossword or folding the laundry? Perhaps it's re-stacking the dishwasher after your other half's had the first go?

Did you know, it only takes 11 minutes of vigorous exercise per day to improve heart and lung function, lose weight and improve muscle strength and bone density?

Granted, not everyone likes exercise. It's much easier to sit on the sofa and lift the occasional glass of red than a few weights. Yet, it's hard to see a downside to being fit and strong - there's grandchildren to play with and shopping that isn't going to lift itself into the car.

The average age in Dorset is now 51, according to the most recent census - that's more than 13 years older than the national average. But that doesn't have to mean more risk of illness and injury - or worse.

Why not spend the next 11 minutes trying out one or more of the below? This series is great to try at home* and you can build up to doing all of them over time. The dishwasher can wait.

Vigorous exercise is subjective, but typically you'll experience an increased heart rate when doing it or warm enough to feel like stripping off a few layers.

Squats

From a fixed/safe seated position, stand up tall - ideally without the use of your arms. Then sit again. Recite the alphabet out loud as you perform the movement and stop when you can no longer speak. Congratulations, you're squatting! Rest and try again when you're ready. Make a note of your rest time, try and reduce that rest time in between sets in future. If you can't do it the first time, it doesn't mean you won't be able to do it next time. Keep at it. Aim for sets of 10 repetitions, but more is better assuming your movement is good.

Good Morning Abs

If and when that's too easy, increase the number of repetitions, and stop using your arms / hands to stabilise. If you can do so safely, supplement this with getting out of bed in the morning without using your arms. It's harder than it sounds and great for your core strength.

Getting up off the floor from seated without using your arms is your next challenge.

Stair Climb

You can combine these with climbing a flight of stairs, or more flights when you're ready. Use your arms to stabilise as you build your confidence and strength. Take care. It's not how fast you can move, it's how slowly you can move properly (and safely).

March / Weighted March

If this is daunting, or you bought that bungalow at number 6, you could try marching on the spot, and progressing to marching and holding a light to moderate object: e.g. a book or small bags of shopping. Remember, you're aiming for 11 minutes.

If this is all too easy, combine chair squats with the stairs.



STINSFORD NEWS

As I write only a few days into March after what appears constant rain it is a bright and beautiful day with little or no wind. The seasonal flowers are showing themselves off at their best. Whilst February 2023 was the driest month, this year it has proved to be the wettest. What extremes but that now appears to be the norm. It was this time last year when folk caught sight of the wondrous Aurora Borealis and this has recently been seen again. I shall keep watching as I have yet to see the northern lights. A new moon on the night of 10th March brought the new astronomical year. The Lunar New Year is said to be an opportunity as ' embracing the new moon's energy allows us to tap into our intuition, align with the rhythms of the universe, and embark on a journey of self-discovery and spiritual enlightenment'. Hardy wrote the poem The Year's Awakening and captured the event with the words "How do you know".

> How do you know that the pilgrim track Along the belting zodiac Swept by the sun in his seeming rounds Is traced by now to the Fishes' bounds he Ram, when weeks of cloud Have wrapt the sky in a clammy shroud, And never as yet a tinct of spring Has shown in the Earth's apparelling; O vespering bird, how do you know, How do you know?

How do you know, deep underground, Hid in your bed from sight and sound, Without a turn in temperature, With weather life can scarce endure, That light has won a fraction's strength, And day put on some moments' length, Whereof in merest rote will come, Weeks hence, mild airs that do not numb; O crocus root, how do you know, How do you know?

This year March had five Sundays with Easter falling on the 31st We are to have a 10a.m. service on this day.

The Dorset Constabulary Police Dogs are in the news as the College has given them permission to access parts of the College Estate to assist with their ongoing continuous training. So do not be surprised if you see police vehicles about day or night anywhere within the 700 acres or so. They have been down to Stinsford Park to view the lay of the land in this area. We look forward to seeing them.

The story of the American Memorial to Thomas Hardy in Higher Bockhampton continues... In the Dorset Chronicle Thursday 16th April 1931 edition, it outlines that an event was to take place at 3.00 pm that day with all local dignitaries plus parishioners taking part: the full coverage in the following week reports that three coaches were available from the Kings Arms from 2.00 pm. The Mayor of Dorchester and Professor Livingstone Lowe spoke, the latter on behalf of the American Admirers, the Secretary to Mr Cecil Hanbury MP. later to become Sir Cecil Hanbury. was present. The land upon which the memorial was installed was made available by Mr Hanbury and estate employees had cleared the ground and turfed the surround. The photograph in the newspaper shows a good crowd with the granite needle standing on land near the path to the heath beyond. Several local dignitaries were present including Alfred Pope, more to follow. It was very difficult to read the information on the old microfiche machine, the modern electric versions being fully employed so I will return to continue further at our marvellous resourceful and helpful Dorset History Centre.

Do not miss the Dorset Spring Show at Kingston Maurward on April 27th and 28th, presented by the team behind the Dorset County Show to be held at Kingston Maurward. Tickets are now available online.

April will continue with the normal range of church services with Evensong at 6.00 pm as we are now in British Summer Time. The prospective date for Stinsford's APCM will be on Sunday 14th April 2024 following the 11am Matins.

Just to mention well in advance the time of the service on 2nd June 2024 will be held at 10.00 a.m. rather than 11.00a.m. It is Thomas Hardy's Birthday celebratory weekend and we see in his window in the south aisle of the church two of these symbols of wind and fire from his favourite text 1 Kings. Ch 19 and the story of Elijah. The service is followed by coffee, readings and the Annual Wreath laying ceremony by the Thomas Hardy Society. The preacher has yet to be announced. It is our usual morning Service where we honour our most famous author and all are very welcome to attend.

CHARMINSTER PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Charlton Down Nature Area restored!

The Nature Area in Charlton Down was created in 2008-2009 by the Parish Council in conjunction with a local volunteer group and with support from the National Lottery.

Over the last 16 years the pond had fallen into disrepair with little maintenance but was still very much used by locals and wildlife.

The Parish Council sought quotes for its rejuvenation with the support of local residents and on 12 February 2024 a contractor started the mammoth task of removing the old pond, reshaping it to allow more access for wildlife and then relining. No animals were injured in this process as all were removed and placed in tanks, then

returned to their new home on completion of the works; we understand they are loving it! There is still work to be done in planting again and repairing the entrance and ground around the pond as the weather was very wet!! But everyone agrees it is good to see it looking almost back to its best.
