Ben would like to visit again as he wishes to make a u-tube version of music from a collection of Dorset churches and Stinsford's organ is unusual as it is a single manual, but he stated it produces wonderful sound in that small space.

Peter was one of the torch holders as it moved through Weymouth prior to the start of the sailing events. He continued his volunteer role throughout both events and presented many pictures of the contestants in Weymouth.

Those of us who went to any events will remember how it infected the whole country and what a great success we, as a nation, had made of both the Olympics and Paralympics.

It was a really interesting talk and Peter asked us to pay his fee to the charity Action Medical.







DUCKLING RESCUE

Ever had to launch an emergency duckling rescue mission?

It's a yearly occurrence for us since our 2020 move to a new home with a big rural pond on the edge of Charminster. This year we were delighted one April morning to see Mummy Mallard proudly quacking round 15 ducklings. 'Better watch out for the heron', I said looking from the bedroom window. 'Oh no, it's stalking already'.

So the first duckling safeguarding patrol was in nightie and wellies, later with my big orange coat on, warding off a very persistent and bold heron, and even a hunting buzzard perched repeatedly in a tree overhanging the water. Sadly something did dine on one of the newly hatched, leaving a rather sad pile of tiny feathers.

But next morning she still had 14 fluff balls .. for about an hour and then when we checked, to our horror, she was down to just two.

'You don't think she's led them across the cattle grid again do you', said wise hubby. This cattle grid at our gateway in arable fields, miles from any cattle, is supposed to keep the deer out of the garden and away from our roses. This cattle grid which, our nature-cam and missing rosebuds show, the deer either leap over in one bound or pick their way round deftly. One day we'll work out a better deer exclusion system.

Meanwhile ducklings beware. Sure enough, there was a cacophonous cheeping from beneath the bars, which are spaced too narrowly for a hand to descend. Despite their inexperience of life and their



tender age, to a duckling they fell silent when our shadows loomed over them. But we could detect their moving position by their scurrying as one, from one end of their concrete cell to the other.

It's a fishing net operation - one big one carefully threaded through the bars and another small beach fishing net to guide them into the larger one. Then a careful and gentle ascension through the bars, into a bucket and back to Mum who's murmuring quack makes them fair fly over the surface of the water to her outstretched wings, cheeping their heads off.

The last netful yielded 5 bright eyed babies, numbers 8-12, job done. But one was a fighter and struggled out of my hand between net and bucket, and into the crook of my elbow. No matter: Hubby to the rescue, except this little fighter put up another wriggling objection and between us we lost hold and it fell down, between the bars and into the gloom again.

It's one thing getting a bunch of ducklings who want to huddle together into a net, and quite another thing to persuade one alone that capture is in its best interest. It took so long that we began, I'm ashamed to say, to wonder if this was a task too impossible to fulfil and whether having rescued 11 of the 12 that had been lost we'd done our bit. But thankfully before we left it to its doom, by some small miracle it accidentally scrambled into the net and on its journey back to mum. Oh happy day; we called it 'the duckling of great price'.

The next task for us each year is to lay a huge dust sheet over the cattle grid and weight it down. Mummy Mallard only stays with us for about 48 hours. There must be nourishment down on the chalk stream that we can't provide. She only has to cross the Old Sherborne Road :-\

No wonder she has to hatch 15 to start with.

There's another female on the pond already and about five desperate drakes harassing her so the dust sheet is still at the ready for the first sign of more ducklings.
