HEALTH AND FITNESS - JUNE - 2024

Ever struggle to concentrate. find vourself getting ratty or giving into cravings? It may be your mind playing tricks, and these tips may help you balance your energy through the day, and avoid resorting to the treat cupboard.

1. Environment design, if there are things that you cannot resist - for me it's crisps, chocolate and biscuits. Save yourself time and stress, and don't buy them. If someone else has bought them, point 5 below will help you.

2. Not all hunger signals are genuine physiological hunger. It's actually hard to tell hunger from thirst. If you feel hungry between meals, drink a glass of water first, and reassess your hunger afterwards.

3. Don't get to starving. Avoid getting really low on energy before you start preparing food, as it can lead to unnecessary snacking - for me that often means sugary foods that hit the spot immediately, and my waistline.

4. If you're going to a friend's for dinner, assume they will serve late, and don't turn up with an empty stomach. This should stop you from commandeering the snack bowl while your pal slaves over the spag-bol until the wee hours.

5. If you struggle with sweet things, my trick is to have bananas on my kitchen worktop. They are full of natural sugar and eating one of those will typically curb my desire for something more naughty. If the craving persists, I make a protein shake with milk. The powder is typically sweet enough, and the milk adds density to keep me going until my next meal. 6. Not all foods are created equal, and some will keep you fuller for longer.
Base your next shop around these Satiety index.

7. Raw vegetables aka mum's secret weapon. When I was growing up as one of 5 children, we would be waiting for hot food that my mum was preparing, the smell was always amazing. In the meantime there would be a selection of raw veg on the dinner table, red cabbage, carrot, celery, cucumber, pepper, tomatoes, fantastic colours. The anticipation of the dinner was such that we devoured the vegetables in minutes. Great, you just provided most if not all of their 5 a day.

8. If you are looking to reduce your body fat, 70% of fat loss results comes from nutrition, 30% from activity levels. 100% from consistency with both. A food diary for a week might help you make an objective assessment.

9. If you're more of a big drinker than a big eater, there are some great tasting nonalcoholic beers & ales (they haven't always been this good). My personal favourite is *Days*, which is stocked in Tesco and served at the Three Compasses in Charminster. Non-alcoholic variants can be up to 50% of the calories of their alcoholic brethren, plus there's no hangover!







STINSFORD NEWS

We are now into the merry month of May, and as the old saying goes you cannot "cast a clout" until the month is out. We wouldn't even think about it at the moment, even with climate change there is a chance of frost or even worse, lightning has been severe in some southern parts. However this morning on waking early mist soon gave way to beautiful sunshine. All around is all new growth , vivid greens on trees and most shrubs, bright yellow dandelions and buttercups in abundance, birds chirping even earlier in the morning. The Goldfinches empty their Nyger seed feeder in a day or two, how many chicks they are feeding I know not but they have very good appetites.

It is also time for Spring cleaning and in turn an overhaul of Wessex Water pumps at Eagle Lodge. A major task, with a large crane, is to lift the two three-ton hunks of iron out of the two bores so that they can be refurbished and returned to their 80-metre-deep holes to the water bearing chalk that forms Dorchester's underground lake. This holds a significant volume of water of fine quality. The lake fed the Eldridge Pope Brewery from its bore, the Beer from which, thanks to skill and water, was rated some of the best in Britain, winning more prizes at a National British Beer competition than any other brewery in the country.

May has brought two bank holidays and festivals and shows. The new Spring Show at Kingston Maurward was a first and enjoyed by many, albeit a little damp under foot followed by the new Dorset Balloon Festival at the Show Ground the following weekend, the latter bringing much traffic and long hold-ups to our roads.

June brings commemorations of D-Day, and several events planned this year. It is also the month of the longest day and mid-summers day, so believe it or not we are well into summer, so let's hope by the time you read this we are enjoying the start of a wonderful warm season. June also brings the Thomas Hardy Birthday weekend and as well as a visiting priest we have a visiting Organist from Salisbury as our regular organist Alistair Simpson plays at St Georges that weekend. The service will be a good mix of a Book of Common Prayer Communion and matching music.

Having completed the church's Annual Parochial Church Meeting, offices have been filled yet we still look for a Secretary, should any parishioner feel like filling the post. The Terrier, a book in which we record all the important business activities and fixtures and fittings, has been checked and signed off. We continue with the proposed building of a new kitchen and toilet . We had a small surplus in 2023 as opposed to a deficit in 2022 so we very much hope that this continues with the introduction of a contactless giving machine in addition to the wall box.

Hopefully the June copy of the Pilot is with you before Monday, 29th May 2024 but there is a free concert at St Michaels on this day where a group of Serpent players will gather together to render 19th century music synonymous with the 'Mellstock' Church. It is between 2.00 pm and 3.00pm and is led by the renowned Phil Humphries. Hope to see you there.



The Kenneth Miles Trust - Charminster

In early 2000 some 8 acres of farm land adjacent to A352 and A37, on the southern outskirts of Charminster, was put up for sale, so a group of residents clubbed together and bought this land to preserve the open spaces.

Miss Olive Miles (a retired farmer) was the owner and when she accepted the offer, it was agreed that it should be held in trust under the name of her late brother, Kenneth. So, on 21st march 2000 under the chairmanship of Ms Eliza Oxley, "The Kenneth Miles Trust" was established with the purpose of "the preservation, conservation, maintenance, restoration and improvement of the Dorset countryside for the benefit of the public".

The trust deeds allow it to acquire and preserve further areas of countryside as a habitat and sanctuary for plant and wild life, hopefully stimulating and encouraging the interest of the public in these activities.

Members of the Trust initially planted a variety of over 500 broad leaf trees under the direction of Dr Tony Warne of The International Tree Foundation. This1.5 acres is adjacent to the village and north of the Wessex Water Pumping Station. These trees are now well established and creating their own natural habitat. The remaining land has been maintained as water meadows for grazing. Currently a local man keeps his sheep there and he is able to take a crop of hay, in addition to the grazing later in the year.

Wildlife conservation has been developed with the introduction of a Barn Owl nesting box, which for the first time in 2020 was occupied and resulted in a hatch of Owlets. Kingfishers are evident along the river banks and wild flowers flourish in the hedgerows.

Access to the Trust land off A352 is constrained by the heavy traffic. However visitors may visit the site but because the land is being farmed, this should

be by arrangement with the chairman.
